waves flood rooms

SURGE

ONE school was closed and a village dwelling was damaged as tidal surges entered hotel rooms along the Coral Coast yesterday.

Nadiri Bay Khalsa School was closed yesterday after tidal swells.

"Early this morning from 5am to 8am, a series of waves washed through the school compound. A few coconut trees on the beach were uprooted and food crops in our school gardens were completely destroyed.

"As a result we instructed children that were arriving to school to return to their homes as a safety precaution," said Nadiri Bay Khalsa School headteacher Bir Chand

shelters used as cooking houses as water raced 10m into the village.
Korolevu police reported that apart from the house flooding in Votualailai Village, there were no other significant events that occurred as a result of the tidal swells.

"In Fijian the word for what is happening is *ua loka*. This is a common occurrence during this time of the year," he said.

Mr Kennedy, owner and operator of Sandy Point Beach Cottages, said in the past the tidal surges broke seawalls and washed debris

"We have had bigger swells in the past," Mr Kennedy said.
